"I'm so excited to see a play that deals with politics!" said no one ever... except Aristotle. We are living in a time when more and more people are saying, "I don't like talking about politics," which is weird considering everything from our quality of life to what we purchase is political. So of course a play about politics is the perfect theatrical choice for Old Town Playhouse to be presenting to the community, and I couldn't agree more.

I am so excited to be a part of this presentation of Tracy Letts' *The Minutes*. The dialogue is sharp and funny, and the story is more relevant today than it was eight years ago when it premiered in Chicago at the Steppenwolf Theatre. 





