



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Director's Note

Growing up amongst a family of creatives, I was exposed to the arts from the start. From a very early age, I watched my mother from the stage footlights portray blind Susan in the murderous thriller Wait Until Dark and as the uproariously drunk sidekick, Vera, in the musical Mame. I was instantly bitten by the theatre bug. My interests expanded as I grew to include books, television and movies, often watching reruns of old programs. I was most intrigued by 3 categories: Live Absurdist humor, Murder/Mystery, and Romance. My favorites were Monty Python, Stephen King books and movies, and television shows like Alfred Hitchcock Presents and The Twilight Zone. As for romance, I absorbed myself with Jane Austin - Pride and Prejudice leading the way.

The Carol Burnett Show was my biggest inspiration behind directing this show. Watching Carol, Harvey, Tim and Vicki, with their rubber faces, in-the-moment comedic reactions, and hysterical, unexpected improvisations began a lifetime's appreciation for true comedic genius. *Gentleman's Guide...* for me is kismet; it's the perfect blend of unbridled humor, creative murder, and the often difficult throes of romance.

A Gentleman's Guide to Love and Murder is a rare gem of a musical—wickedly funny, charmingly irreverent, and irresistibly clever. It revels in its own theatricality, inviting us to take a deliciously dark journey through Edwardian England, where ambition knows no bounds, and murder is merely a stepping stone to success. It's a perfect combination of my love for Humor, Murder, and period Romance.

At its heart, this story is about Monty Navarro, a man who, upon discovering his aristocratic lineage, sets out to claim his birthright—by any means necessary. But beyond the laughs, the disguises, and the ever-rising body count, *Gentleman's Guide...* also asks us to consider the absurdity of social status, the cost of ambition, and the unexpected ways in which love complicates even the most meticulous plans.

This production has been a joyous collaboration, filled with the kind of energy and creativity that make live theater so magical. From the quick-change artistry of our D'Ysquith family to the razor-sharp timing of the cast, every moment has been crafted with care, humor, and a deep appreciation for the show's witty spirit.

As you watch, I invite you to revel in the mischief, embrace the madness, and perhaps—just perhaps—root for Monty as he sings, schemes, and stumbles his way to the top.

Josiah Starr is an actor, musician, and filmmaker. He enjoys, among other things, movies, music, swimming, hiking, and long walks on the beach.

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
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
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
