#### A Note from the Director

On our Tech Sunday, the rehearsal that blends all the technical aspects of a show with the actors lines and stage movement, we fared very well. Our show has just a few sound cues and very little lighting challenges so we had little problem putting the tech into the show. I have worked on tech rehearsals that have lasted more than 8 hours, some even longer. Our tech rehearsal, start to finish, took all of 4 hours for this two hour show.

In celebration and to mark the baton passing, I took the entire cast and crew to our local pub for a beverage of their choice. I meant one beverage each not just one beverage to share. Conversation ensued with much discussion of the problems we had during our rehearsal. In tech rehearsals lights flash unexpectedly, sound may happen ... or not, a door that worked perfectly well fails to close or ,worse yet, open, which causes actors to drop lines, add lines and generally lose their place in the play. That shows why we rehearse. I spoke of baton passing.

Tech Sunday marks the exit of the Director as leader of the troupe and puts the Stage Manager in charge going forward. I will stay on to give notes during the week before Opening Night but blocking is frozen and what you will see cannot be altered by mortal persons ever again. Save the vagaries of human memory and such.

I eavesdropped on the various conversations around the table and thought back to the auditions several weeks past. About the excitement of picking a cast and crew and forming a troupe to put on this play. I remembered all the little things we did to get character and not walk into furniture. All the discussions about why I wanted this or that and the actor wanted that or this. Creating a play is a give and take of ideas and talent.

As I walk away from this work and watch the actors and running crew strut their stuff, I feel elated that I did the best I could, dejected that I am, now, a peripheral character to the play going forward and excited for the play, players and you, the audience to see this collaboration of many talents take the stage.

## AUTHOR BIOGRAPHY

## DAVID LINDSAY-ABAIRE

David Lindsay-Abaire is a Pulitzer Prize winning playwright, screenwriter, lyricist and librettist. Lindsay-Abaire won both the 2023 Tony Award for Best Book of a Musical and Tony Award for Best Original Score for the musical adaptation of his play Kimberly Akimbo. His play Good People premiered on Broadway, was awarded the New York Drama Critics Circle Award for Best Play, The Horton Foote Prize, The Edgerton Foundation New American Play Award, and two Tony nominations. His previous play Rabbit Hole received the Pulitzer Prize for Drama, five Tony nominations, and the Spirit of America Award. David also wrote the book and lyrics for Shrek the Musical (Jeanine Tesori, composer), which was nominated for eight Tonys, four Oliviers, a Grammy, and earned David the Kleban Prize as America's most promising musical theatre lyricist. David's other plays include Ripcord, Fuddy Meers, Kimberly Akimbo, Wonder of the World and A Devil Inside, among others. In addition to his work in theatre, David's screen credits include his film adaptation of Rabbit Hole (starring Nicole Kidman, Oscar nomination), Dreamworks' Rise of the Guardians, and The Family Fang, among others. He is also, along with Tanya Barfield, Co-Director of the Lila Acheson Wallace American Playwrights Program at the Juilliard School.


